29.	Working Cow Horse. If at any time a judge feels that the contestant is out of control endangering themselves and/or their horse, the judge may terminate the work and a score of will be given. Rule #
30.	Trail Point Penalty. Both front or hind feet in a single-strided slot or space at a walk or jog. Rule #
31.	Amateur Breakaway Roping. This is a timed event with a time limit. Rule # time limit.
32.	Reining. Excess rein may be straightened anytime during the pattern, provided the rider's free hand remains behind the rein hand. Any attempt to alter tension or length of reins from the bridle to the rein hand is to be considered use of two hands and a penalty score of will be applied. Rule #
33.	Working Cow Horse. Working out of position Point Penalty. Rule #
34.	Amateur Hunt Seat Equitation. Obviously looking down to check leads or diagonals. Faults. Rule #
35.	Trail. Trotovers and lopeovers cannot be elevated in classes. Rule#
36.	Working Hunter: A good performer that jumps all fences reasonably well, an excellent performer that omits one or two minor faults. Score: Rule #
37.	Amateur Hunt Seat Equitation. Complete loss of contact between rider's hand and the horse's mouth. Faults. Rule #
38.	Amateur Goat Tying. Should the contestant run over the goat or rope with his horse while mounted, he will be fined Rule #
39.	Yearling In-Hand Trail. The spacing for walkovers shall be and may be elevated to Elevated walkovers should be set at least 22" (55cm) apart. Rule #
40.	Limited Working Cow Horse. Each contestant upon receiving a cow in the arena, shall hold that cow on the prescribed end of the arena for, demonstrating the ability of the horse and rider to control the cow. Rule #
41.	Barrel Racing. A penalty will be assessed for each barrel knocked over. Rule #

42.	Yearling Longe Line. This class should be looked upon as a class that defines what it means to be a

43.	Timed Events. The judge, at his/her discretion, may a contestant for excessive use of a bat, crop, whip or rope. Rule #
44.	Ranch Riding. Hoof black, braided or banded manes or tail extensions. Score: Rule #
45.	Amateur General Show Rules. A Masters exhibitor in Masters or Amateur classes may show up to two different horses in classes (Showmanship, Western Pleasure, Horsemanship, Hunter Under Saddle, Hunter Hack, Hunt Seat Equitation, Equitation Over Fences and Pleasure Driving) as long as one horse is shown in the Amateur group class and a different horse is shown in the Masters group class. Should the class be combined, the Masters exhibitor must choose which horse to exhibit. Rule #
46.	Reining. Each time a horse is out of lead or had a delayed change of lead, a judge is required to deduct point. Rule #
47.	Solid Paint-Bred/Breeding Stock Rules. If offered as an all Paint registries class, Solid Paint-Bred and regular registry horses shall compete but be awarded points based only on the number of horses competing in the respective registry type. Rule #
