
Net Results – World Show & Gift Show 2023 vs. 2022






Net Results – The Halter Million & Gift Show 2023 vs. 2022

Paynt Points Incentive Program



How it works

- Added money incentive (added money + entry fee = total purse each 6 month period)
- APHA guarantees a portion of the purse each year, other purse money is funded by an additional \$2 per entry fee to be charged with the current \$1 per entry processing fee
- Total purse will be divided by total points earned every 6 months
- Money paid out through Payee Choice with US Bank bi-annually on a per point earned basis
- Fee would be charged to all divisions and all entries. Money would be paid out in ALL Amateur and Youth classes to the owner/lessee at time points are earned.
- Geographically decentralizing the incentive gives everyone an opportunity to win money back at APHA shows of their choosing, not just the APHA WS and Chrome Cash

Additional Information Amateur and Youth Only With World Show & Halter Million

Out of 4,665 unique horses showing worldwide in 2022, 956 horses showed in Open only (20%) and 3,709 (80%) horses showed in multiple divisions of Open, Amateur, Youth. 80% of the horses shown in 2022 would be eligible to win money in this new program.

Out of the 3,709 horses that were eligible for a payout, 2,512 earned .5 of a point or more (68%).

Examples of Amateur and Youth Only With World Show & Halter Million

Exhibitor A

- shows at a 4-judge POR in 4 classes
- additional \$2 entry fee would be \$32 total additional expense
- If they win 1 point under each judge in those 4 classes, their payout would be approximately \$160.

Exhibitor B

- shows at 4-judge POR in 8 classes
- additional \$2 entry fee would be \$64 total additional expense
- If they win 1 point under each judge in those 8 classes, their payout would be approximately \$320.

Examples of Amateur and Youth Only Without World Show & Halter Million

Exhibitor C (annual example)

- Exhibitor C of Salem, NJ showed to 30 judges at 8 shows for 178 entries in 2022 earning 136 Novice Amateur Points
- Under current structure she earned \$0 dollars for her fantastic accomplishments
- In the Paynt Points Program she would pay an additional 178 x \$2 = \$356 in entry fees
- With Paynt Points in place, she would earn \$1,360 (136 points x \$10 =\$1360) for the same accomplishments.
